

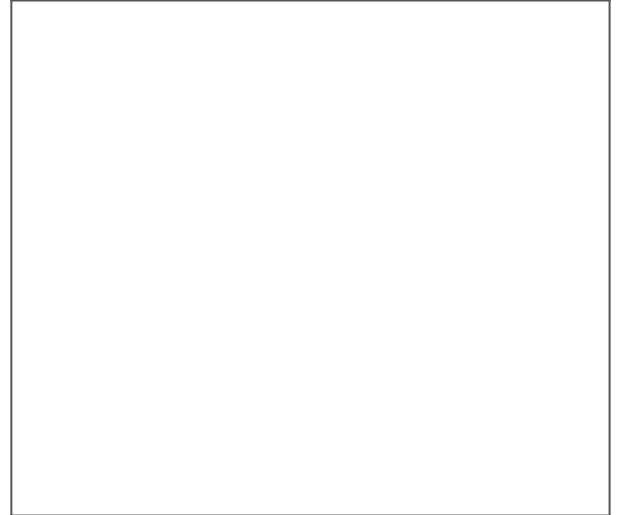
## Appointments, Elections & Recognition
