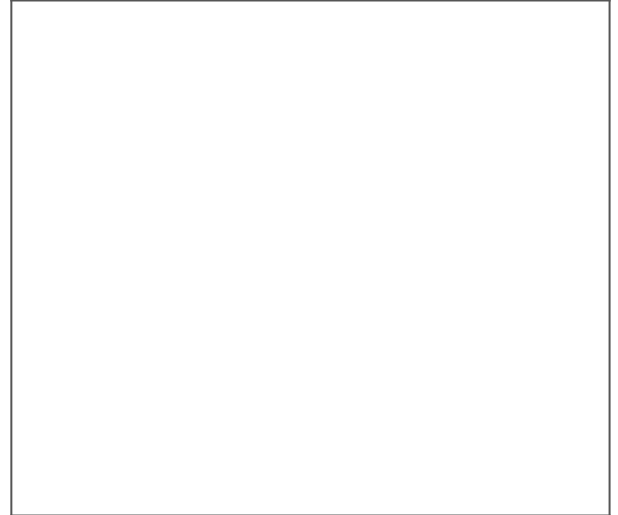


## Retirement of Nate Nurgitz
