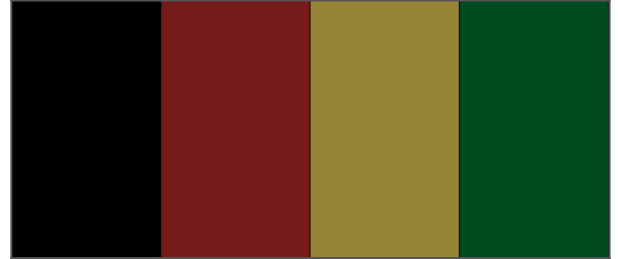


TDS Honours Black History Month
