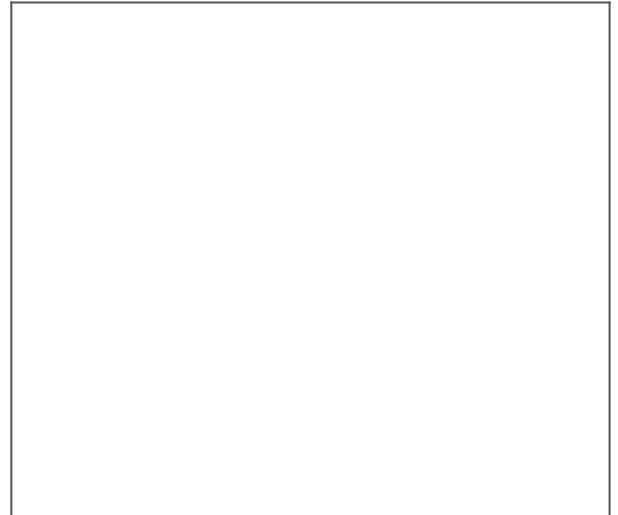


TDS Law Congratulates Lawyers on their Calls to the Bar
